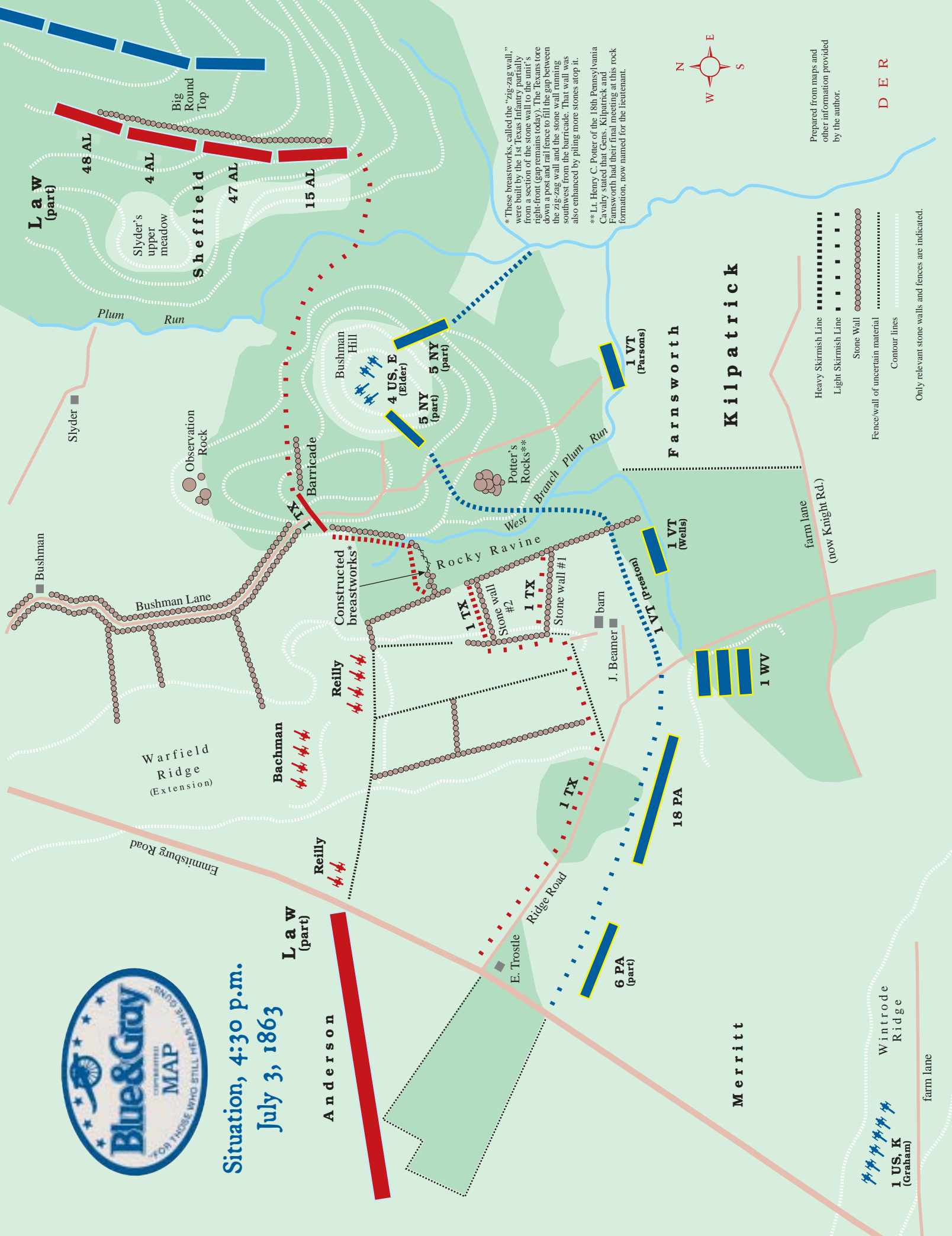

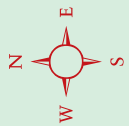

* These breastworks, called the "zig-zag wall," were built by the 1st Texas Infantry partially from a section of the stone wall to the unit's right-front (gap remains today). The Texans tore down a post and rail fence to fill the gap between the zig-zag wall and the stone wall running southwest from the barricade. That wall was also enhanced by piling more stones atop it.

** Lt. Henry C. Potter of the 18th Pennsylvania Cavalry stated that Gens. Kilpatrick and Farnsworth had their final meeting at this rock formation, now named for the lieutenant.
